



Dove-Tale Volume #8: 3rd. Quarter On the Cover

Pictured are the four spoke shaves in the same order as on the cover. Left 3 are bronze and all without maker's names. The bronze shaves may be used as router planes; however, the 2 center shaves have a fence and may perform edging or groves parallel to the edge. The iron shave makes groves and having two cutters, with the lead cutter scoring the edge, making it possible to grove cross-grain.













LIE-NIELSEN Open House, & lobster bake: July 2010 A few of the demonstrators for the 2 day open house.
